It has been a pleasure to work with such a warm-hearted wonderful person for last 2 years.

I was titled "director" in 2020 on our board of Zonta Club of Lafayette, When I was asked to be a vice president a year later I was lost. Soon I found myself being lifted and pulled in to action by Dory. She took me under the wings and groomed me to take the responsibility.

I soon realized she is a very warm hard-working person full of empathy but also dynamic. I learnt a lot from her during my tenure. I could not help myself but thinking while club members know her as "president" she must still be known and recognized for her talents. She is truly a DIY person. When she shows me the pictures of renovating her house it truly is "awe" inspiring. Briefly, her personality development below reflects who she is today.

Dory was born in New Orleans in 1952 and, at the age of four, moved with her family to New Iberia, where she remained for many years. She exhibited artistic talent at a young age and was a natural at sketching, painting, sculpture, wood working, and carpentry. She traveled to Florence, Italy after graduating high school, which cemented her love of the arts and art history.

Dory earned her bachelor's degree and teaching certificate at USL, and soon after began what would be a 36-year career as an educator. She also earned her Master's degree in education technology from NSU while working full time and caring for her 3 children. After retiring from a rewarding career of inspiring countless students, she moved to downtown Lafayette to be within walking distance to the music and culture that she enjoys and to be closer to her beloved grandchildren.

Dory grew up in a small town, but always had a big, open mind. She is a lover of animals, and was known to bring in stray cats and dogs when she was a young girl. She is a problem solver, a doer, and a hard worker who never tires of fighting injustice and helping those in need.

### Woman of Achievement



Crystal Scrantz is a humble woman who is an outstanding member of our community. She has provided many hours of service and advocacy for hundreds of females in our Acadiana.

Crystal has been an advocate for survivors of domestic violence for over twenty years. Her experiences have included the provision of direct services to adults and children affected by "domestic violence, program development, 1--IUD housing programs, navigating civil and criminal court systems, database management, supervision, and training. Crystal has worked on many community-based domestic violence projects including a High-Risk Response Team, Fatality Review Panel and VOICES of Acadiana. She has conducted trainings regionally, statewide, and nationally on issues affecting survivors of domestic violence. Crystal is passionate about survivor safety and is committed to ensuring that high quality, trauma informed services are provided to survivors of domestic violence in Louisiana." Crystal worked long hours for over two years to implement the establishment of the Family Justice Center. This center opened in 2016 and provides comprehensive services to our community by allowing easy access to law enforcement, legal services, counseling, and support services all under one roof.

VITA also helps adult learners work toward their high school equivalency diploma. In Louisiana, the GED test has been replaced with the HiSET, which stands for High School Equivalency Test. The test has five parts: reading, writing, mathematics, social studies, and science. VITA offers classes in all of the test subject areas. We also offer an Essential Education program for those interested in studying at home on their own schedule.
